Allan Wesley York, Jr., age 88 passed away peacefully in the late hours of May 2, 2024.

Allan was born June 15, 1935, in Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, Kingston Borough, to Allan Wesley York, Sr. and Elizabeth Janet Burke.

Allan earned a bachelor's degree in political science, attending Franklin and Marshall College.

Allan worked for the National Security Agency (NSA). He spoke Russian and German. He went on to work for Xerox as a salesman and then began his own business, York Sales Associates.

While serving the United States of America with the NSA, Allan was drafted by the United States Army in November 1958. He earned the rank of E-4 and an Army Good Conduct Medal. Allan received an Honorable Discharge from his enlisted service on November 4, 1960. On the same day, he received a direct commission as a First Lieutenant, branched in Army Intelligence and Security. Allan received an Honorable Discharge from his service as an officer in March of 1967.

Allan York was a Life member of Taylors Lodge #345, having served 55 years in Masonry. He received his fifty years away in 2022. Allen was a member of the Greenville Valley of Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. He laid down his working tools and entered that Celestial Lodge Above.

Mr. York was the longest member of Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Fairfax, Virginia.

Allan married his beloved wife, Nancy Louise Rutter York July 20, 1957.

Nancy was his high school and college sweetheart. They had a beautiful 67 year marriage and 75 years of being best friends.

Besides his beloved wife Nancy, Allan is survived by, one daughter, Jennifer York Cumberland; one son, Christopher Allan York; and three grandchildren, Abigail Wheeler, Emily Wheeler, and Cailyn York.

Allan was a beloved husband, caring father, and grandfather. He was a blessing to everyone he met. Allan was a quiet man of integrity and loyalty, whose faith in Christ, and family were most important to him. May he rest in peace in the arms of Jesus.
