Charles (Rex) Robey, 80, went to be with the Lord on November 28, 2013 after a long struggle with cancer.

Mr. Robey was born August 24, 1933 in Great Falls, Virginia and raised in Dunn Loring, Virginia. Son of the late Felton and Annie Robey, he was a U.S. Army Veteran of WWII and Korea and a cartographer for the Department of Defense for 34 years. Mr. Robey had received the Lord as Savior in 1957 serving in several churches as deacon and teacher. He had been a member of Valley Bible Church since 1989 serving as Chairman of the Board for 7 years. Most recently, he was a member of The Church of the Valley in Strasburg, Virginia.
