



Conrad N. Robertson

April 17, 1931 - January 2, 2016

Conrad Numa Robertson, 84, husband of 56 years to the late Violet Obena "Beannie" Few Robertson, died January 2, 2016.

A native of Union County, he was a son of the late Mary Phillips Robertson, and was reared in the home of his grandparents, Rev. Numa M. Phillips and Frances Anne Phillips. He was a retired Executive Vice-President and Treasurer of the Bank of Greer and United Carolina Bank, a US Army Reserve veteran, and member of Memorial United Methodist Church. Mr. Robertson was a member of the Greer Lions Club, Woodmen of the World, the Foothills Emmaus, a delegate to the South Carolina Annual Conference and former church organist.

Surviving are a son, Mark Rowe (Robbie) of Charlotte, NC; three grandchildren, Cameron, Rachel and Derrick Rowe and two nieces, Julia Dragoun and Emily Gomez.

Funeral services will be held 3:00 p.m. Monday at Memorial United Methodist Church, conducted by Rev. Joe Cate. Entombment will follow in Woodlawn Memorial Park Mausoleum.
