“ My sincere sympathies for your immense loss. Many memories of my high school years in Cabot have come to mind in the last days and weeks of time I spent at the Pryor house. I remember that one Friday night I had stayed over with Marianne, probably playing a long game of Risk (there are no short games of Risk) with some of the very young men that Mr. Pryor had invited over who were stationed at the air base. The next morning, I was enchanted with the way Mrs. Pryor gave brisk directions in her delightful British accent: "Victoria, I would like you to be in charge of the dusting this morning." In charge? Really? That made it sound almost like a privilege!

*This same time period of the late 1970's was during the counted cross-stitch craze. Mrs. P. was often stitching a project and I always enjoyed seeing what she was working on. I loved looking at her needlework wall filled with projects large and small and in between. She showed me a pattern book of small motifs and explained how she could whip something up in no time, perhaps personalized with a name and date, put it in a little frame, and, as she said, "Presto! You have a small gift!"*
