“ Don was my oldest brother - the oldest of the seven Campbell brothers. He had the biggest heart of anyone I've ever known. He worked hard and never complained about it. He'd give a stranger in need the shirt off his back. He was a rock.

Our dad died when I was 4 years old, leaving behind my mom, my brothers and me. Don was 11 years older than me and, growing up, I remember so many acts of kindness from him. He took me places, like the hobby shop so I could look at model trains (and sometimes he'd even buy trains for me, despite how scarce money was for us). Losing Don, my surviving brothers and I have a hole in our hearts. But we also have a place in our hearts where our big brother will always be.
