“ I grew up with Randy--we are distantly related. We played together and spent many nights camping, or sleeping at our house after a hard day of playing ball, fishing, swimming in the river, or hunting. Once, when we were teenagers, he, my brother Larry, and I had access to only one car. I drove one evening, dropping them off at each of their girlfriend's houses, and then I went to my girlfriend's house. I left late, then each of them was slow to leave their girlfriend's when I stopped to pick them up. So we were going to miss my mother's strict curfew. I drove too fast, and the car spun out of control in a sharp curve. I remember Randy sitting calmly beside me advising me to turn the steering wheel a little more this way, then a little more back the other way as we slid backwards into someone's yard. God saved us from injury and the only damage done to the car was that the tailpipe was knocked off when we slid backwards over a small embankment. Randy's advice saved us from flipping the car and minimized the damage. We agreed to tell my mother the truth that we backed over a bank and knocked the tailpipe off, but we agreed to not tell her the whole truth which included the fact that I had been driving 80 mph when I lost control. Almost every time I think of Randy I remember his calm voice giving advice in the middle of that scary episode. I will miss him.
