Franklin Duff "Popeye" Cooper, 78, husband of Evelyn "Boots" Cody Cooper died December 22, 2012 at Spartanburg Regional Hospice Home.

A native of Spartanburg County, he was a son of the late Levi J. and Bessie Hendrix Cooper, He was a US Air Force Korean and Vietnam Veteran Retired. Mr. Cooper was the first Airman from Spartanburg County to be wounded in Vietnam. He was a car salesman and retired from Nodine's Auto Sales.
