Herman Harold Campbell, loving husband of Delores Streetman Campbell, died November 5, 2011 at McCall Hospice House of Simpsonville.

He was the son of the late Smiley and Lessie Campbell.

Born April 24, 1928 in Campobello, he grew up in Simpsonville. He joined the Navy in WWII and served aboard the USS Darby DE218 as a sonarman. In 1950 he joined Life of Virginia where he worked until his retirement in 1983. During the 1960's he was district manager in Columbia where he studied business law, economics and financial strategies at USC. He earned his C.L.U. degree there. He was an avid sportsman who enjoyed boating, fishing and skiing. He was also a single digit golfer and the highlight he loved most was his only hole-in-one which was witnessed by both his sons on an outing celebrating their birthdays. Herman was a kind and generous man who loved to make people laugh. He was a member of Fairview Baptist Church.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two sons and daughters-in-law, Steve and Terri Campbell and Dale and Lisa Campbell; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Mr. Campbell was predeceased by two brothers, Raymond and Ralph Campbell.
