Homer J. High, 93, passed away August 14, 2022, at 2:30 a.m. at Leconte Medical Center in Sevierville, Tennessee after a short illness.

Homer was born on February 16, 1929, to Raymond and Ethyl High. He grew up as the second youngest of nine children. He did not complete high school and began working at Jackson Mill. During his time, he met his loving wife, Sara, whom he lost 20 years later. He later went to work at Tool Technology, which became Homberg Electronics. 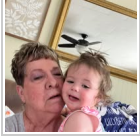
