



James "Buddy" Keller Jr.

January 12, 1941 - January 28, 2023

James Smiley Keller, Jr. 82, passed away January 28, 2023, surrounded by his loving family, following a courageous four-year battle with prostate cancer. A native of Greenville, SC, son of the late James "Smiley" Keller, Sr. and Earline Sloan Keller, he was a United States Marine Corps Veteran and a member of Taylors First Baptist Church for 55 years.

Buddy was a man of many titles. Faithful Husband, Father, Grandfather, Great-Grandfather, Faithful Brother, Marathon Runner, Mountain Cyclist, Fitness Guru and Inspiration, Mayor of Pivotal Gym, a Gold's Gym Legend, and a faithful Servant of Jesus Christ.

He attended Berea High School through his Junior year and then transferred to Travelers Rest his Senior year to prepare for entrance to Clemson College in 1959. There, he met Pat Murphy, his wife of over sixty years, with whom he got a date on a bet. From then on, they never loved another.

Married in June of 1962, their covenant marriage remained until death parted them last Saturday morning.

He was a third generation, 42-year employee of Norfolk Southern Railroad. Starting as an 18-year-old brakeman, he rose through the ranks to the position of Road Foreman of Engines, where he trained, qualified, and supervised locomotive engineers for the Piedmont Division.

For the last ten years of his career, he had the only job on the division that still gave him butterflies. He was the man who took the coal trains down Saluda Mountain, the steepest grade east of the Mississippi River. With tons of coal

pushing and tons of engines, he had to keep the downhill speed below 15 miles per hour to keep the train under his control. He was an expert who never lost control of his train.

After retirement he began a 22-year career in charity work as a Sunday School teacher of elementary and preschool children at Taylors FBC. He was a leader for Child Evangelism Fellowship at the Good News Clubs at Taylors Elementary, Woodland Elementary in Greer, and Bob Cashion Elementary in Simpsonville.

He was a 22-year Red Kettle Bell volunteer at Christmas for The Salvation Army, drove a route for Meals on Wheels, and supported many missionary groups locally, in the United States and Alaska, and in Africa.

In his spare time, Buddy loved to play music – country, bluegrass, and gospel songs. He was a self-taught musician. He played the guitar, banjo, mandolin, and harmonica, often playing for and entertaining residents at a nursing home in Marietta. He also played for his children and grandchildren at Christmas time, at the beach, and any chance he could. He especially loved when his wife, Pat, and other family members would play along with him.

A born-again follower of Jesus Christ, he was devoted to memorizing Scripture, even whole books of the Bible that he would recite on his 100 miles-per-week cycling excursions, in order to keep God's Word fresh in his mind. Surviving are his wife, Pat Murphy Keller of the home, three sons, John K. Keller (Kim) of Greer, James "Bo" Keller of Taylors, and Clifford K. Keller of Arlington, VA; one daughter, Mary Keller of Greenville, SC; three brothers, Ronnie Keller (Cheryl) of Greenville, SC; Ricky Keller (Linda) of Honolulu, HI, and Donny Keller of Pickens; three sisters, Janice Durham (Darrell) of Taylors, Cherryll Collins of Travelers Rest, and Belinda Rubio (Gus) of Travelers Rest; eight grandchildren, Keller DeBruhl (Meghan), Jay Keller (Maddie), Carly Douglas (David), James Keller, Rachel Langel (Patrick), Elizabeth Keller (Zach Keels), Hope Ennis (James) and Joshua Keller; and eight great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 11 am, Wednesday, February 1, 2023, at

Taylors First Baptist Church, conducted by Dr. Doug Mize. Burial will follow at Mountain View Memorial Park, Travelers Rest, SC.

Visitation will be held prior to the service, 9:30 - 10:45 am, at Taylors First Baptist Church.

The family will be at the home of his son and daughter-in-law, John and Kim Keller.
