Jean Martin Flynn, 89, of 210 W. Main Street, died October 18, 2006 at her home.

Born July 11, 1917 in Easley, she was the daughter of the late James Theron and Jennie Woodside Martin Flynn. She graduated from Winthrop College and had a master's degree from the University of South Carolina, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. She did her first teaching at Whitmire High School, was on the faculty at North Greenville Junior College for 15 years, and retired from Greenville Technical College. Miss Flynn was the Author of Histories of North Greenville Junior College, Taylors First Baptist Church, and the Second Baptist Church of Pickens, Barnwell Baptist Church other books included an account of Taylors 1817-1994, the Militia in Antebellum South Carolina Society, The Boy from Glassy Mountain, and How to Write Well. For a number of years, she was the Taylors area correspondent for the Greer Citizen. She was a member of Taylors First Baptist Church.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. S.T. Turner, Jr. of Greenville; a sister-in-law, Jane Flynn of Morehead City, N.C.; four nieces and three nephews.

Funeral services will be held 2 p.m. Friday in the Chapel of Taylors First Baptist Church, conducted by Dr. Ernest Carswell. Burial will follow in the church cemetery.

Visitation will be held from 1 p.m. until 2 p.m. Friday at the church.
