Joseph Neal Glenn, formerly of Atlanta, GA and Greer, S.C. passed away suddenly on February 27, 2009 at his residence in Wiesbaden, Germany.

Joseph was a U.S. Air Force veteran of the Vietnam era. He was described by DynCorp supervisors and colleagues as one of DynCorp International Corporation's best C-12 mechanics, whose engine rigging capabilities were second to none. He worked on C-12s since 1976 and had worked on government aircraft all over the world with Stephens Aviation, Raytheon Aerospace, Beech Aerospace, Capital Aviation and DynCorp International. His 30+ years of experience in fixed wing aircraft maintenance and logistics support, included over 25 years in total maintenance of U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force RC-12 and C-12 tactical military aircraft.

Joseph was a loving husband, dad and friend. He was a man of character and integrity. His passion in life was aircraft mechanics. He also enjoyed golfing and loved all aspects of military history.

He is survived by his wife, Judite; two sons, Anthony and Daniel; a daughter, Deborah; a sister, Miriam Andrews and a brother Steven Glenn.

Mr. Glenn was predeceased by a brother, Michael Glenn.
