Joyce Evelyn Baker was born September 3, 1923 to Albert and Ethel Wright in London, England. She learned early in life the value of hard work during the economic difficulties of the depression, and the premature loss of her mother when she was 7 years old. Her father was a veteran of the Great War. His profession was as an upholsterer.

Great Britain entered the Second World War on her sixteenth birthday. Her life as a young adult was shaped by the influences of the war in the UK from 1939, and a husband serving in the Royal Air Force of Great Britain.

They immigrated to the United States in the 1960s and travelled extensively, living a full life and in various countries including living in Canada and Aruba. She worked in administration and was a devoted Mother and wife of 70 years. She never lost her love for her home country, England. She always appreciated a good cup of tea, and had a great sense of humor.

Joyce is predeceased by her husband, Alan Baker, and her son Kenneth Baker. She is survived by two daughters, Ann Lange (Manfred) of Germany and Ruth Baker-Hayes of England. Also surviving are her daughter in law, Marijke Baker, seven grandchildren, and seventeen great-grandchildren.
