Lawrence Neil Comeau, 70, died August 28, 2013 at Village Hospital. A native of Lynn, Massachusetts, son of the late Neil Joseph and Edna Wollerschied Comeau, he was a U.S. Air Force Veteran and a retired employee of G.E.

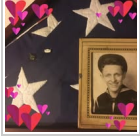
Yes, he used to provide music in the lodge. He had a "devious" mischievous sense of humor that was enticing.
