



Leland "Lee" Alewine

April 29, 1922 - November 28, 2020

Leland "Lee" James Alewine, 98, widower of Sara Margaret Ridgeway Alewine, passed away November 28, 2020.

A native of Taylors, South Carolina, son of the late George "Pete" Wells Alewine, Sr. and Myrtle Elizabeth Taylor Alewine, he was President/CEO of Taylors Lumber Company, a member of Taylors First Baptist Church and a US Army veteran of World War II.

Surviving are two daughters, Libby Thruston of Greenville and Anne Alewine of Taylors; one brother, Francis T. "Corky" Alewine of Taylors; one sister, Fannie Nell Alewine of Taylors; one grandchild, Amy Griffith (Chance) of Easley and three great-grandchildren, Keegan, Kaden and Gracie Griffith all of Easley.

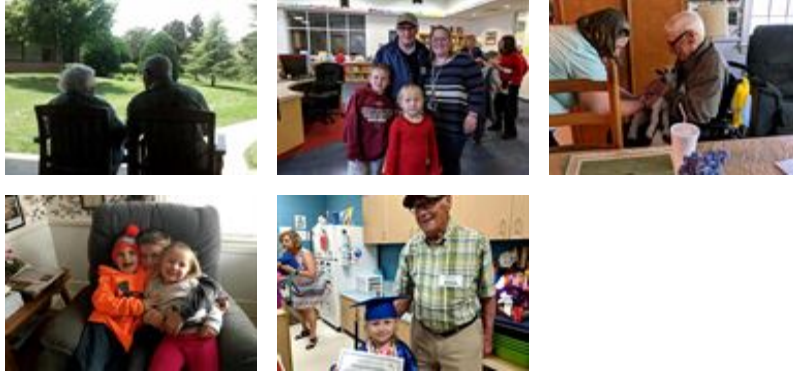
