Surviving are a son and daughter-in-law Scott and Dawn Demauex of Taylors and two nieces, Gail Wieland and Lorie Poublon.

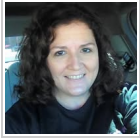
She was predeceased by a brother, Paul Poublon and a sister, Lillian P. Fischer.
