November 24, 1933 - March 6, 2025

Lottie Ann Hamby Satterfield, 91, widow of Wilbur Satterfield, went home to be with her Lord and Savior Thursday, March 6, 2025.

Lottie was born November 24, 1933, daughter of the late John Thomas and Mamie Elizabeth Miller Hamby. She was a long-time employee of Vince Perone's City Club and a faithful member of Cross Roads Baptist Church. Once the City Club closed, Lottie was a server at Main Street Diner in Mauldin and finally retired from Piasano's in Greenville in her late 70s to care for Wilbur. She dedicated many years to serving her customers, brightening the days of countless individuals with her friendly conversations and unwavering kindness. Whether remembering a regular's favorite order or offering a comforting word, she had a way of making everyone feel special. For her family, she was the glue that kept us all together. She was always up for a visit or call and you never left without knowing exactly how she felt about the conversation. She was a hard worker and expected the same out of her family.

Surviving is a son, Ricky Satterfield (Retha Wilson); a granddaughter, Stephanie Atkins (Tripp); a grandson, Brandon Satterfield (Jessica); seven great-grandchildren, Cole, Ellis, Selah, Micah, Aida, Eden, and River; a daughter-in-law, Wanda S. Goodwin; and many special nieces, nephews, and special church friends and neighbors.

Mrs. Satterfield was predeceased by two sons, Randy and Robbie Satterfield, a great-grandson, Zion Satterfield, four brothers, J.T., Charles, Fred, and
