



## Mack Cantrell

July 20, 1950 - December 1, 2025

Mack Maynard Cantrell, a devoted father, hardworking craftsman, and proud Greer native, went to be with the Lord on December 1, 2025, at the age of 75. A native of Greenville County, son of the late Bill “Mood” Cantrell and Pearl Sloan Dickerson. Mack built a life defined by dedication and deep love for those he held dear.

Mr. Cantrell was the beloved father of two daughters, Angie Few (Russell) and Crystal Sehlke (Shannon), who were his greatest joy and lifelong source of pride. Also surviving are long-time partner, Judith Hudson and two grandchildren, Ryland and Emeree Few.

He was predeceased by three sisters Barbara Brackett, Sybil Shelnut, and Betty Elder.

A man known for his strong work ethic, Mack’s career spanned several industries and showcased his versatility and commitment. He first lent his skills to Taylor’s Peach Shed, Greer Mill, and C. E. Runion Manufacturer Company. Mack also contributed to major local projects during his time with Daniel Construction and Ken Thrasher Construction where he worked in steel erection and miscellaneous construction. He also excelled in the rigging supply field spanning a 40-year career with Riggers Service and Supply/Carolina Chain and Cable as an Assistant Manager.

Before beginning his professional journey, Mack made his mark on the football field. He played football for Greer High School from 9th through 12th grade, earning both Best Defensive Player and Most Valuable Player. Following

graduation, he participated in the North–South All-Star football game, a testament to his talent and determination. In 1998, Mack received one of his greatest honors—induction into the Greer Athletic Hall of Fame for Football a recognition that remained one of his proudest accomplishments. Later, he also attended Gardner-Webb University briefly playing for the Runnin' Bulldogs football team.

Mack's faith was a steady foundation in his life. He was a member of both Southside Baptist Church of Greer and O'Neal Baptist Church of Greer where he found community, strength, and purpose.

He was an avid antique and glass bottle collector who enjoyed visiting flea markets and antique bottle shows. He also had an impressive record collection that stemmed from his love of music.

Mack will be remembered for his boisterous strength, his humor, and the steadfast love he showed to his family. His legacy lives on in his daughters, and the family he cherished.

A visitation will be held 4:00-6:00 p.m., Friday, December 5, 2025, at The Wood Mortuary in Greer.

A celebration of life will be held at the family home of Angie Few located in Greer to honor Mack, a man who worked hard, loved deeply, and lived life to the fullest, following the visitation.

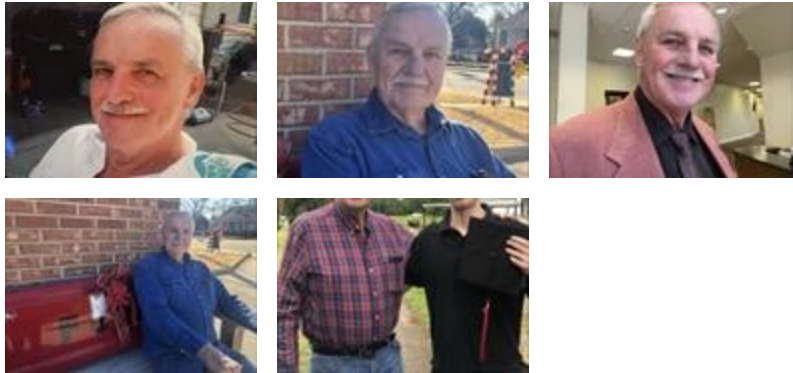
