Marguerite Steptoe Cox, 89, of 2960 E. Gap Creek Road, and widow of Virgil Queener Cox, died December 4, 2009 at home.

A native of Scotland Neck, Halifax County, NC, she was a daughter of the late Charles Elliott Steptoe and Bess Steptoe Sessions, and the step daughter of the late Benjamin Eason Sessions. She was predeceased by two brothers, Charles Nelms and Leon Elliott Steptoe.

Mrs. Cox attended Women's College of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. She was a long time and faithful member of First Presbyterian Church of Greer where she was actively involved through the years. She was the chair person of the Care of the Congregation committee, Circle Chairman and Treasurer and member and chairman of many other committees. She was a member of the Piedmont Club in Spartanburg and an honorary member of the Greer Golf and Country Club. She especially loved the young people and supported and encouraged them in their many activities.

Surviving is a daughter, Nancy Cox of Lexington, KY and many close friends, several nieces, nephews and cousins.

Funeral services will be held 1 p.m. Monday at First Presbyterian church of Greer, conducted by the Rev. Brandi Casto-Waters and the Rev. Ray White. Burial will be in Wood Memorial Park.
