Mildred Wortman Rochester, 91, widow of Leon James Rochester, passed away June 20, 2023.

She was born September 21, 1932, in Blacksburg, South Carolina, the last of thirteen children of D. C. and Nancy Crow Wortman. Later her family moved to Greer, and upon her graduation from Greer High School, she began work at Southern Bell as an operator. She flourished at Southern Bell and moved up in the 1960's breaking the "glass ceiling" being only one of two women in the Southeast doing what was classified as a "man's job". She was active in her community in the Jaycee's and the Pioneers (Southern Bell retirement group), where she served as President. Her main mission was to her church, which she gave much time and money until the end. All who knew her were better off. Her love and kindness will be sorely missed.

Surviving are her son, Jimmy Rochester, Jr. and his companion, Connie Seay, six grandchildren, one great-grandchild and one sister, Mavis Elledge. She was also blessed with several angels that she was so grateful for (you know who you are).

She was predeceased by her husband of 50 years, Leon James Rochester; Melvin Kirby, a longtime companion, and special friend; one grandson; and eleven brothers and sisters.

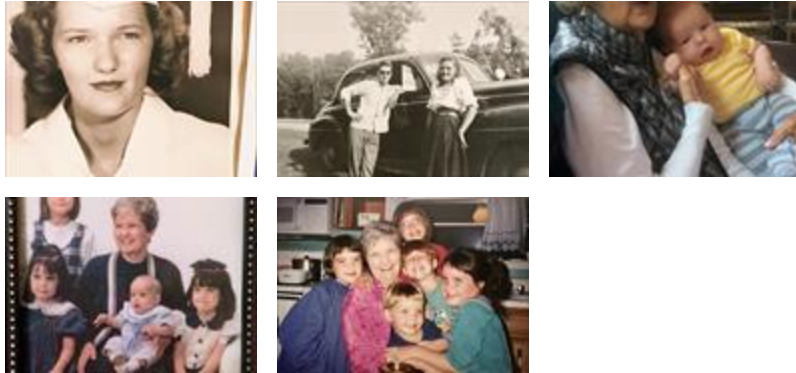

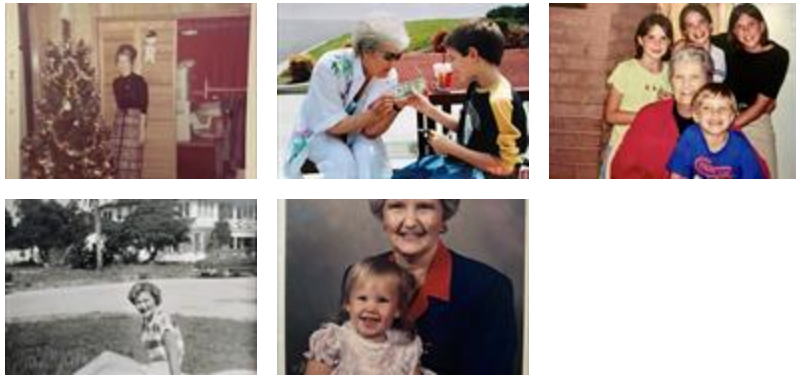
