



Norman Peace

September 23, 1937 - March 1, 2025

Norman Peace, 87, husband of the late Patsy Cole Peace, passed away March 1, 2025.

Born in Greenville County to the late Samuel Earl and Margie Lee Slatton Peace. He graduated from the first Class of Blue Ridge High School in 1955. He worked at Cecil Stone Upholstery Shop before joining the Navy in 1959. He trained at the Naval Training Center and was sent to Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis, then returned to Charleston Naval Base where he served as a medic. After his return, he opened Norman Peace Auto Trim Shop. Norman then started drag racing at Ware Shoals Dragway and Greer Drag Strip. On October 25, 1958, he won the first race at Greer Drag Strip in Top Eliminator and ran D Gas. Later, he was the owner and mechanic with several dirt track race cars with his two brothers. Norman was a used car wholesale dealer most of his life. He was also a motorcycle enthusiast.

Surviving are seven daughters, Vicki Foster McGee, Lynn Foster Luypen, Brandy Peace Aguilar (Jesus), Amber Brown, Brianna Peace, Brittany Peace, and Grace Peace; two foster daughters, Pam Taylor and Reba Roque; a brother, Wilson Peace; two grandsons, Evan Luypen and Joseph Aguilar; two great-granddaughters, Taylor Tidwell and Hailey Taylor; a great-great-granddaughter, Aaliyah Eccles; and two great-great-grandsons, Jax Lancaster and Cole Lancaster.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by a brother, Bobby Peace and a granddaughter, Nicole Brank.

Funeral services will be held 2:00 p.m. Saturday, March 8, 2025, at Ebenezer Welcome Baptist Church conducted by Rev. Vince Gainey. Burial will follow in the church cemetery.

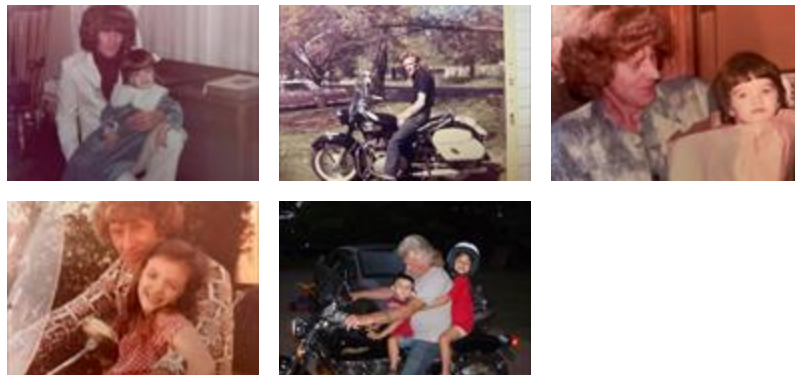
