



Dr. Raymond Van Grubbs

July 23, 1946 - December 19, 2020

Dr. Raymond Van Grubbs, 74, husband of Jennifer Burgin Grubbs passed away Saturday, December 19, 2020.

Born in Oconee County, he was the son of the late Raymond Benjamin Grubbs and Swanee Pitts Grubbs. He was a graduate of Clemson University and the Medical University of South Carolina. He was a general surgeon in Greer, S.C., and a member of the Fellow American College of Surgeons, where he served as teller for the past 40 years. Preceding his death he worked as Medical director with National Health Care. He served as the physician of the U.S. Olympic Kayaking Team and wrote the first E.M.S. handbook. He served his country well as a Captain of the U.S. Army.

Living life to the fullest, he was an instrument rated pilot, Captain of his own Boat "No Agenda", track doctor at Darlington Raceway for 30 years, a certified scuba diver, rode motorcycles on many cross country excursions, an epicurean of food and wine, and was passionate about jaguars and motor homes. He read a book a day and loved relaxing with his animals by the ocean. He was a true adventurer and gentleman. Having the biggest heart, he made an impact on many lives. He treasured his family and friends.

Surviving are his wife, Jennifer Burgin Grubbs of the home; one daughter, Phyllis Caroline Grubbs of Piedmont; two sons, Raymond Van Grubbs, Jr. of Pelzer and Timothy O'Brien Fagan of Asheville, N.C.; four grandchildren including Margaret Elizabeth Morris of Rock Hill, Taylor Koble of Germany and Zoe Britain McCuen of Piedmont. He has one great grandchild Aurora May

Baucom of Rock Hill.

An honoring memorial service will be held Monday, May 3, 2021 at The View Point at Buckhorn Creek, 3411 State Park Road at 3:30 p.m. Friends and family who would like to ride in the Bike procession should meet at Harley Davidson of Greenville center stage at 2:30 p.m. From there we will ride to the venue. “ Most know Van as Raymond but growing up in Fair Play with him, he was Van and will be forever Van to me. His dad was the mail carrier and his mom taught us all in the third grade at Fair Play school. We all lived in “ down town Fair Play”. Van’s back door was about 50 yard from my back door so we spent many hours together between the two houses. I could tell you story after story about Van so I will only do one. After school his mother would listen to the soap operas on the radio and paid little attention to two 12 year old boys. Most of us already knew how to drive but we had no permits until age 14. Van’s dad did not finish is mail deliveries until 4:30 or so. They had a mint green 1955 Ford. That afternoon Van got the keys to this ‘55. We were smart enough to know not to start it for our joy ride because his mother would hear the engine. We pushed the car out of the drive on to the main drag in Fair Play and coasted past Wallace’s store before we fired the engine. Being a straight drive all we did was turn the key, clutch it and she fired right off. We took only a 3 minute drive around Fair Play. Our plan was to coast back into the garage so his mom would not hear a thing. However, that day his dad finished his mail route early and was sitting on the garage bench when we returned. He ask us if we had a good drive. There was a bamboo patch between Van’s house and my granddaddy Mays. It was spring and the shoots were everywhere. Mr. Raymond carried a little sterling silver pocket knife and he proceeded to walk over to the bamboo patch. He cut a nice keen shoot about 3 feet long. Van and I both received the joys of that bamboo that afternoon. No need to say we waited until our 14th birthday before we drove unsupervised. I will miss you my friend. All the good times we had together in Fair Play and Charleston at MUSC will forever be in my memory.
