Rev. Jake Randolph Cox, 81, of 108 Crestwood Drive, died August 27, 2011 at his home.

A native of Greenville County, he was a son of the late Avery and Anna Holcombe Cox, a member of Peoples Baptist Church and a retired Baptist Minister and served Oneal Baptist Church, Hickory Road Baptist Church and Double Springs Baptist Church in NC. Rev. Cox was also a retired employee of Sew Euro-Drive. He was a US Air Force Veteran of the Korean War and received the Medal of Honor.

Surviving is his wife, Christine Paris Cox of the home, one son, Michael Cox and his wife, Connie, of Greer; two brothers, Don Cox and Perry Cox both of Greer and five grandchildren, April Butler, Brian and Heath Cox, Travis and Heath Brown, and seven great grandchildren.
