Rev. Jesse Melvin Morris, 80, of 123 Blue Water Trail, went home to be with the Lord on November 1, 2010 at Greenville Memorial Hospital.

A native of Chicopee, Georgia, son of the late Robert Lee and Minnie Ruth Herrin Morris, he was a U.S. Air Force veteran of the Korean War, a retired employee of Greer Commission of Public Works, and a member of Pleasant Grove Baptist Church.
