



Robert "Bob" G. Hall

January 17, 1939 - July 19, 2022

Robert Grayson "Bob" Hall, 83, of Greer, joined his parents, Arlie and Nell Hall, and Christian family and friends in Heaven in the early morning hours Tuesday, July 19, 2022.

Bob was born and raised in West Virginia, graduated as an engineer from Virginia Tech, and spent his adult life living in the Upstate of South Carolina. He worked most of his career at the Greer Mitsubishi plant before retiring fully in the mid-90s.

Mr. Hall met his one and only true love, Betty on a blind date in 1956 and married a few short years later in 1962. Bob spent the next 60 years fulfilling his vows to her and setting an example of Christian household leadership for their three children, Greg, Chris, and Lynn. His love and commitment to them was evident in all that he did.

The best single word description of Bob is that he was a "builder". Naturally, he built the house that he and Betty lived in since 2001, and too many pieces of furniture to count over the years for their family and friends. More importantly, he loved to build relationships. It typically only took one encounter with Bob to become a life-long friend. At work, church, community, and in many cases, even simple casual encounters, he forged friendships who loved him for his engaging conversation, authenticity, infectious smile, and joy for life. He will be remembered for his laid-back personality, commitment to finishing the job, sacrificial giving, and positive attitude. A life of service for others.

He had many gifts and interests. He was an avid genealogist, gardener, photographer, golfer, and loved music. He played the clarinet and in addition to singing in the church choir, loved singing with barbershop quartets. He was passionate about watching Clemson football and in recent years, became a huge fan of the Clemson softball team. He spent the last 52 years of his life serving Christ as a deacon, coach, and choir member at Taylors First Baptist Church.

In addition to his wife and kids, he is survived by his brother, Bill Hall of West Virginia. He has a wonderful son and daughter in-laws, Holly Hall (Greg), Kim Hall (Chris) and Daniel Pascazio (Lynn) and 10 surviving grandchildren, Grayson, and Audrey Hall (married July 16, 2022), Savannah Grace, Andrew, and Isaac Hall, Luke and Ozzy Hall, and Anna, Betty Kate, and Ruthie Pascazio. "PePa" joins his grandson, Eli Hall, who gave him that name, in Heaven.

The family is forever grateful to doctors and nurses at Greer Memorial Hospital for the care and love given to Bob in the last month of his life. Funeral services will be held 2:00 p.m. Friday, July 22, 2022, at Taylors First Baptist Church. Burial will follow in Taylors First Baptist Church Cemetery. 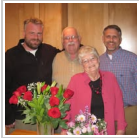
