Robert Elias Cunningham, 92, of 911 Hudson Road, widower of Sarah Evelyn Baker Cunningham, died April 16, 2010 at McCall Hospice House.

A native of Greenville County, son of the late P.D. and Lucy Mitchell Cunningham, he was a U.S. Marine veteran of WWII having fought in the Battle of Iwo Jima, a retired supervisor from Freeman Mechanical and a member of East North Street Baptist Church.

Surviving are four daughters, Linda Barton of Greer, Susan Manus of Greenville, Robbie Rader of Taylors, and Jeanne Molnar of Greer; a son, Barry Cunningham of Liberty; nine grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held 3:00 p.m. Sunday at East North Street Baptist Church, conducted by Rev. Steve Stroup. Burial will follow in Woodlawn Memorial Park.

Visitation will be held 2:00-3:00 p.m. Sunday at the church.
