Robert David Booker, 74, of 40 Spur Street and husband of Jennie Henerey Booker for 56 years, passed this life on February 27, 2007.

Born in Spartanburg County, he was the son of the late Hubert L. and Nell Gardner Booker. Mr. Booker was a graduate of W.L.T. High School, Class of 1950, attended Bruton Parker College, and received his degree in theology at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. He was a bi-vocational pastor and served churches in Georgia and South Carolina. He was owner and operator of Booker Heating and Air and was a U.S. Navy veteran of the Korean Conflict. Mr. Booker was a member of Temple Baptist Church in Simpsonville, a member of the Duncan A.F.M. Lodge #309, a 32nd Scottish Rite Mason, and a York Rite Mason.

Also surviving are one son and daughter-in-law, R. Jeffery and Elaine Duggan Booker of Summerville; two daughters, Jennie (Jen) McCue of Duncan and Jill Booker of Wellford; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Mr. Booker was predeceased by a brother, Charles M. Booker.

Funeral services will be held 6:00 p.m. Friday at the Wood Mortuary, conducted by his nephew, Timothy (Abby) Abercrombie.

Nephews and nieces will serve as honorary attendants.
