It was the first time she met my son, Stone, and it brings laughter to me still that Stone confused Robin and my mother just like I did almost 30 years prior. My son loved her instantly and adored their dog Oz. Stone and I stayed with Robin and Mike at their gorgeously decorated South Carolina home for the

True to form, her guest room was just like a first class resort room: linens perfect, everything just right, beautiful appointments, towels rolled, personal fancy soaps, and even a private microwave with tea service and a robe. Every attention to detail was made and she made it seem effortless and natural in a way that most just couldn't. And she always gave you your space and appreciated quiet time. On that last stay I really cherish our hours and hours long last conversation. I felt closer to her than ever. I could talk to her like a mom AND a friend, and always with humor and ease. And for some reason I can only understand today as I write this, I held back the tears as I hugged her goodbye after that stay. We had a photo taken together and she and I looked so much alike! I never thought it would be my last hug, the last conversation, the last of our many visits over many years. Always will my Auntie Robin have a special place in my heart. I love her like a mother and a friend. I will miss her perfectly chosen birthday cards with just the right words. I will miss seeing her. My heart goes out to her family, her twin my mother, her two other sisters, to Mim, and especially to Michael and Meghon. It happened so soon. I love you Robin!
