Sandra Faye (Smiley) Burd Burge, 72, passed away July 24, 2014 at Mountain View Nursing Home. A native of Charleston, West Virginia, daughter of the late Raymond V. and Mildred Brown Burd, she was a former employee of Michelin and a member of Praise Cathedral Church, Greer, SC.

Sandy took piano lessons as a young lady and sang in her church and high school choirs. She danced on pointe throughout her high school years in Joyce Potter's lavish dance recitals held at the DuPont Playhouse in downtown Wilmington along with both her sisters. She was the go-to-person with errands, cooking and taking care of her little sister, Karen. Sandy was very active in her church youth group activities & was a girl scout. She spent

most summers during the 50's and 60's in Cape May, NJ with her brothers and sisters and there are many happy memories created on the beaches there together; she was also a great jitterbug partner during Friday and Saturday night family ballroom dance outings at the elegant Convention Hall in Cape May. Sandy went to Norway for her graduation gift and stayed with friends of the family there. We are all sure she turned a quite a few Norwegian male heads that summer. She married and moved to SC, having four children, and also finished her college education at the University of SC Spartanburg, with a degree in elementary education.

Mrs. Burge was very active in her church and discovered her true calling in the late 90's to lead support groups for those who were hurting and in need of emotional and spiritual healing. Sandy, a.k.a. Smiley, would knowingly or not, strategically follow someone, befriend them and simply love on them covering them with Jesus with every word she spoke. She coerced people out of their shells and showed that it is ok "to just be" because her Heavenly Father, Daddy Abba, created us as "human beings" not "human doers". She taught many people thru various classes about Gods unconditional love. One of her favorite sayings: There is NOTHING I can do to make God love me more. There is NOTHING I can do to make God love me less. She taught many people to embrace their A.G.O. (Awful Growth Opportunities), those moments in life that are seemingly unbearable, and made her workshops a safe place to feel any emotion, and grow from it, in a supportive, calm environment. She guided many people to the hand of Jesus and He would then lead them on the path to individual healing. Through this painful healing she received joy as an obedient servant of her Loving Father. All this to say anyone privileged to come in contact with Sandy left changed. They became better people, better spouses, better parents, better siblings, better children, better co-workers and because of this, marriages remained intact, and are flourishing, relationships were restored, forgiveness was granted. Thank you, Sandy, for loving us to Jesus and His healing grace. These were words her children heard from many people. She loved her family deeply and loved Jesus and fulfilled her desire to

make people smile. Smiley will be remembered always.
