Waymond W. Leonard, 83, of 1951 Reidville-Sharon Road, died June 29, 2006 at his home.

A native of Spartanburg County, son of the late Asa P. and Pearl Edwards Leonard, he was a U.S. Navy veteran of WWII, a partner in Leonard & Howell Builders, a farmer, and a member of Abner Creek Baptist Church, where he was past deacon and Sunday school teacher. He was a member of the Reidville Masonic Lodge #102 and the V.F.W., vice-president of Reidville Historical Society, and a member of the Hejaz Shrine Temple. Mr. Leonard was a charter member of the Reidville Volunteer Fire Department.

Surviving are his wife, Kizzie Conwell Leonard of the home; a son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Thomas and Carolyn Leonard of Wilmington, North Carolina; a daughter and son-in-law, Patsy and Larry Farr of Moore; a sister, Helen Howell of Taylors; and five grandchildren, Maggie Leonard, Claire Leonard, Tommy Leonard, Whitney Farr, and Richard Farr.

Mr. Leonard was predeceased by a brother, A. Allan Leonard and two sisters, Louise Leonard Jackson and Sara Leonard Scoggins.

Graveside services will be held 2:00 p.m. Sunday at Abner Creek Baptist Church Cemetery, conducted by Rev. Frank Keels and Rev. Wallace Hughes. Visitation will be held after the service at the church.

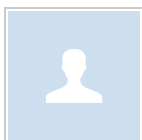
