William Burton Coxe, Jr., husband of Mary Perrin Coxe, died Thursday, February 28, 2008.

He was a native of Greenville and was the son of the late William Burton and Edna Earle Evans Coxe.

He served in the Army Air Corps at the close of World War II and graduated from Clemson College in 1949 with degrees in textile engineering and chemistry. He was a member of First Presbyterian Church in Greer and was a member of the St. Andrews Society of Upper South Carolina.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two daughters, Perrin Coxe Kreidler of Greenville and Isabelle Coxe Mercado of Greer; two sons, William Burton Coxe, III of McDonough, GA and Neill Macaulay Coxe of Cumming, GA; and six grandchildren. Also surviving him is a sister, Mrs. Clifton L. Bryson (Lillian) of Memphis, TN. He was preceded in death by his sister Isabelle Coxe Cely. A memorial service will take place at 2pm Sunday at First Presbyterian Church in Greer.

The family will receive friends at the church immediately following the service and also at the Kreidler residence, 224 Lake Fairfield Drive, Greenville.
