William Hubert Dill, 86, of Taylors, husband of Doris Vaughn Dill for 64 years died May 4, 2019.

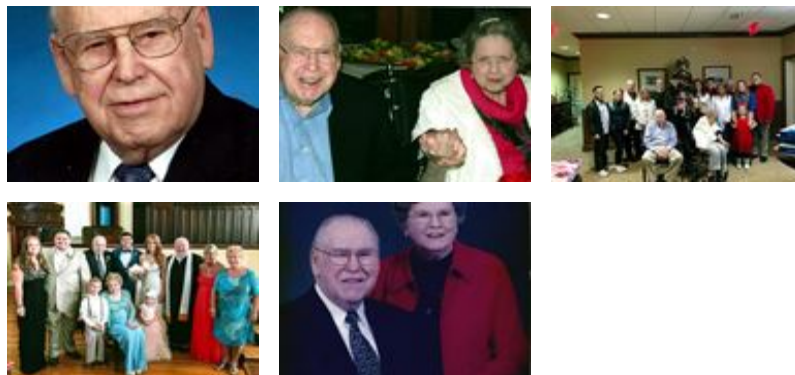
